

Charleston Radio Control Society (CRCS)

FIELD RULES

1. You must be a member of CRCS to use our flying field. Guests are exceptions, all must be an active member of AMA.
2. No unqualified pilot shall fly without a qualified pilot standing by.
3. Frequency flags will be on all transmitters.
4. All flyers shall strive to become qualified.
5. Frequency pins will be on those transmitters in use. No transmitter will be turned on without the pin. Collapse the antenna when not in use.
6. No flying behind the pits, over the spectator area or over homes adjacent to the field.
7. No spectators unescorted in the pit area.
8. Engines will not be run for extended periods in the pit area.
9. No drinking of alcoholic beverages at the field.
10. Do not hog the frequency pin.
11. Maximum of four planes (power) flying at one time.
12. If you are the last to leave the field – LOCK THE GATE.
13. Do not abuse the buildings or farm areas.
14. Keep the trash off of the ground. Use trash cans.
15. Volunteer to assist in maintaining the field.
16. Volunteer to assist interested spectators.
17. Help new members.
18. Drive slowly when dust is present on the road.
19. Park in designated areas.
20. Observe the muffler rule. All engines .19 and over must have a muffler.
21. Use of cellular telephones is prohibited during flying operations.

GLIDER FLYING

1. No launching lines, hi-start or winch, across the pit area.
2. Launching and flying will take place as close to the normal takeoff and flying areas as possible.
3. When no power planes are present, gliders may be launched from anywhere on the field.
4. Frequency pin control at all times.
5. A whistle should be used to call attention to glider launch or landing.
6. Gliders will observe the general field rules when flying and landing.
